for
Excellence in Teaching Innovation

The Boyer Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching Innovation was established by Ralph L. Boyer, and consists of \$1000 and a plaque. It will be presented at the Faculty Awards Banquet to be held this spring.

CRITERIA

The award will be presented to a faculty team or to an individual faculty member in the College of Engineering that has made outstanding contributions to the improvement of undergraduate engineering education. The award is meant to recognize the demonstrated impact of innovation in the education process, including the design, development and application of new pedagogy, teaching tools (e.g., multi-media), and assessment methodologies on the overall quality of the undergraduate engineering education process/experience at OSU. Selection will favor faculty whose contributions have made important, pervasive improvements in the engineering education process with a significant potential for long term impact.

Please note that this award is not intended to recognize lifetime achievement or high teaching ability, or as a grant to support new ideas that have not been implemented.

NOMINATIONS

Each Department in the College may submit one team, or individual for nomination. A letter of nomination, at least one external letter of support, and supporting materials shall be submitted as the nomination packet. Supporting materials should be brief and to the point, yet with sufficient information to permit rational selection. At least one letter from an external source, solicited without input from the nominee, is required. Nominations must include a citation of no more than 50 words, highlighting the reasons for the nomination. This citation will be used in the program if the nominee is selected for this award.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

The Selection Committee will be the College Honors and Awards Committee.

DEADLINE

The application materials will all be submitted electronically. The total nomination package must be submitted by February 27, 2009.
